YARD WASTE / SPECIAL TRASH

Beginning July 6, 2009, "Special Trash Pick-Up" (brown and white goods) will be collected by zone on a monthly schedule the same as your Yard Debris Monthly Schedule.

"Brown Goods" include old furniture, TV's, mattresses, grills, and boxes of general household trash. NOT MORE THAN ONE PICK-UP TRUCK LOAD of these items will be collected per month.

"White Goods" are major appliances such as refrigerator, freezers, air conditioners, water heaters, washing machines, dryers, and dishwashers. NOT MORE THAN TWO of these items will be collected per month.
